HOW TO DONATE A DEER

Donating a deer through Hunters Sharing the Harvest is a very simple process. Drop off a whole deer at one of our participating processors found closest to where you live or hunt. You may also donate any portion of a deer. Simply let the processor know to set aside a specified amount to be reserved for the HSH program. You will be asked to pay the portion of the processing fee that applies to your kept venison.

Simply follow these steps to donate a deer

Enjoy a safe and successful hunt



Carefully field-dress, legally-tag and report your deer harvest



Take the whole deer to any HSH processor near where you hunt or live



Complete the HSH donor receipt form verifying your donation



Know you just helped feed the hungry in Pennsylvania

Since 1991, Hunters Sharing the Harvest (HSH) has coordinated the processing and distribution of donated venison from hunters to hungry people throughout Pennsylvania. This sportsmen-inspired outreach program effectively channels wholesome venison via a network of registered and inspected deer processors and food banks down to local charitable organizations in our urban and rural communities. HSH has evolved as a respected partner with deer management practices throughout the Commonwealth, and together with the PA food banks, food pantries and charitable hunger-relief organizations, we are able to help put food on the tables of hungry Pennsylvanians.

The HSH program is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit Pennsylvania charitable organization with funding and support primarily derived from a mix of public and private sources. HSH has developed into a preferred, nationally-recognized model many other states have replicated. HSH was founded as the signature mechanism for Pennsylvania hunters to demonstrate their personal and compassionate decision for helping low-income individuals and families with extra venison. Many wildlife management units in Pennsylvania offer multiple deer tags, longer seasons and special hunting opportunities that result in extra deer being donated to our program.

Based on this unique concept of sharing, the program's success is due to the cooperation of our processors, our volunteer county coordinators, our board of directors, state legislators, state and local agencies, our many supporters and sponsors who help fund the program, and in concert with our colleagues from a dedicated outdoor news media. All these components work together with a common mission to maximize the best-utilization of a valuable wildlife resource to help others needing food assistance.

HSH remains the most effective social-service program for hunters and wildlife managers to directly make a difference for those in need. More than 1.5 million Pennsylvanians are classified as living beneath the lowest-income poverty level, and as the recent economic reports indicate, the need and requests for food assistance continue to grow.

HSH is looking for those who can **educate**, **donate to**, and **participate** in this statewide program. Donations of deer, financial support through our BUCK FOR THE POT campaign, HSH sponsorships and grants and volunteers donating their time, are greatly needed to fuel this program. Help us reach our yearly goal of processing and distributing 100,000 lbs. of venison to feed the hungry in Pennsylvania.

Since March 2020, as a result of the pandemic's economic consequences, PA charitable food network organizations have documented a 46% increase in demand and need compared to pre-pandemic numbers. HSH donated venison has never been more important for so many!
